There are two words **origin** and **beginning** worthy to be consider as synonymous.

For example

There has been a **colossal** waste of public money. **colossal** and **enormous** are synonymous.

5) **PROLIFERATE**- If things **proliferate** they increases in number very quickly.

For example In recent year commercial cultural travel and other contacts have **proliferated** between Taiwan and China.

So reproduce is the **appropriate** synonym of **proliferate**.
